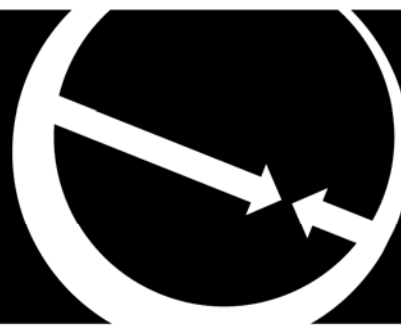

Program

In cooperation with Arcadia University, Ohio State presents an opportunity to study at the Arcadia University Center for Hellenic, Mediterranean, and Balkan Studies in Athens. Students may enroll for the full academic year, one semester, or a summer term.

Location

Contemporary Greece is a land of exciting and inspiring contrasts. You will find picturesque islands, rugged mountains, isolated rural villages, and huge modern cities. You will be studying in the city of Athens which is the center of Greek life, housing the country's oldest and largest University. In addition to the major sights of Athens, such as the Acropolis and the Olympic Stadium, you will be able to enjoy the street markets and meet Greek people.

The Center

The Arcadia University Center, located in the residential neighborhood of Pangrati, will be your University in Greece. The Center houses classrooms, program reference library, and student computers with e-mail access. You will be taught by Greek and American professors and have use of local resources for your field study work.

Courses and Credits

Arcadia University offers many courses in Archaeology, History, Language, Literature, and Modern Greek studies. All students must take Modern Greek language classes. For information about course offerings, please visit arcadia.edu/abroad. Specific course equivalencies and credits will be determined by the appropriate Ohio State academic departments.

Accommodations

Students will share fully furnished apartments in Pangrati, 15 minutes walking distance from the Center.

Program Costs

Students will pay the Arcadia University program fee plus partial Ohio State tuition. The Arcadia University program fee includes tuition, housing, on-site orientation, and overseas insurance. Airfare, books and supplies, personal expenses and independent travel are not included in the program fee.

Students participating in Ohio State-approved co-sponsor programs will receive a credit on their Ohio State Statement of Account from the Office of International Affairs (OIA) in order to off-set the cost of tuition.

The dollar amount of this credit will be based upon the number of quarter credit hours the program yields.

Students are responsible for paying any balance due on their Ohio State Statement of Account in addition to the co-sponsor institution's program fee.

Note: This applies to each quarter of registration at Ohio State. Non-residents are required to pay the Ohio State non-resident fee in addition to the aforementioned fees.

Pre-departure Orientation

Students are required to participate in a pre-departure orientation organized by The Office of International Affairs. The orientation date/location will be provided in the letter of acceptance.

Application Information

Students must complete two applications.

- Arcadia application and accompanying materials should be sent directly to Arcadia University. The Arcadia application may be completed or downloaded from arcadia.edu/abroad.
- Office of International Affairs Study Abroad Application: buckeyelink.osu.edu. **Please note** that upon application, a \$150 application fee will be assessed to your Statement of Fees and Accounts. The application fee will be refunded only if you are not accepted or submit a written request to withdraw your application prior to the application deadline. If you withdraw any time after the date of your notification of acceptance to a study abroad program, you will be responsible for any non-recoverable costs that have been incurred on your behalf plus a \$200 cancellation fee.

Passports

Passports are required for every Ohio State study abroad program. For many study abroad destinations, passport information is required to apply for an entry visa (as early as 6 months prior to departure). For information about applying for a passport, go to travel.state.gov. A Greek student visa is required for semester and year students.
