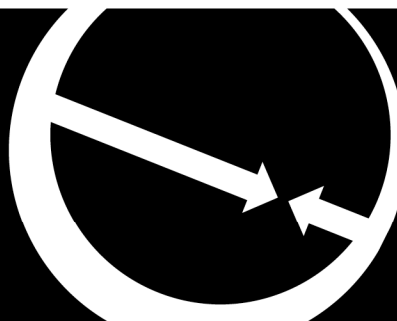

### Program

Through the Council on International Educational Exchange (CIEE), Ohio State students have the opportunity to study Turkish culture and language in a traditional university setting. The program includes volunteer opportunities, excursions to local villages, visits to Byzantine and Ottoman monuments, visits to religious places of worship, and the opportunity to participate in music, film, dance, art and other cultural festivals.

#### Location

Istanbul is the largest city in Turkey and the economic and cultural capital of the Republic of Turkey. Istanbul has a rich history, having seen the rise and fall of both the Byzantine and the Ottoman Empires. Today, Istanbul is a beautiful city spanning over two continents with a vibrant culture.

#### Courses and Credits

All students are required to enroll in a Turkish language course and four additional courses, taught in English, at Koç University. See [ciee.org](http://ciee.org) for course listings and descriptions. Specific Ohio State course equivalencies will be determined by the appropriate Ohio State academic departments.

#### The University

Founded in 1993, Koç University is a private university located on a beautiful hillside campus overlooking the Black Sea, near the Sariyer district of Istanbul. Designed as an English-medium liberal arts university, courses are taught in English. The campus includes excellent facilities and has a vibrant student campus life with numerous clubs and special activities.

#### Accommodations

Students typically shared a double room with a Turkish student in a campus residence hall.

#### Program Cost

Students will pay the CIEE program fee plus partial Ohio State tuition. The CIEE fee includes airport pick-up, instruction, housing, excursions, and international health insurance. Airfare, meals, independent travel, personal expenses, books/supplies, and passport/visa costs are not included.

Students participating in Ohio State-approved co-sponsor programs will receive a credit on their Ohio State Statement of Account from the Office of International Affairs (OIA) in order to off-set the cost of tuition.

The dollar amount of this credit will be based upon the number of quarter credit hours the program yields.

### **Pre-departure Orientation**

All students will be required to participate in an on-campus pre-departure orientation organized by the Office of International Affairs. The date and location of the orientation will be provided in your letter of acceptance.

### **Application Information**

Students must submit two applications.

- Office of International Affairs Study Abroad Application: [buckeyelink.osu.edu](http://buckeyelink.osu.edu). **Please note** that upon application, a \$150 application fee will be assessed to your Statement of Fees and Accounts. The application fee will be refunded only if you are not accepted or submit a written request to withdraw your application prior to the application deadline. If you withdraw any time after the date of your notification of acceptance to a study abroad program, you will be responsible for any non-recoverable costs that have been incurred on your behalf plus a \$200 cancellation fee.

### **Passports**

Passports are required for every Ohio State study abroad program. For many study abroad destinations, passport information is required to apply for an entry visa (as early as 6 months prior to departure).
